What is "CONSORTIUM DIPLOMATIQUE EUROPÉEN"?

CONSORTIUM DIPLOMATIQUE EUROPÉEN (hereinafter "CDE") is an organization dealing with various aspects of foreign affairs, including the resolution of humanitarian crises following natural disasters and other disasters. CDE was established to combine diplomatic and humanitarian efforts into a single, effective, and coordinated initiative.

CDE works as an independent organization that strives to provide urgent humanitarian aid in the event of natural or other disasters. It operates within the framework of the international community which focuses on helping countries affected by various disasters.

CDE strives to collect the funds necessary for the provision of humanitarian aid, the implementation of tasks and activities, and the strengthening of international cooperation in the direction of coordination between countries and international organizations.

As an organization acting in the public interest in the field of foreign affairs, CDE is committed to promoting cooperation between countries and strengthening international relations to ensure peace, stability, and prosperity.

Each organization has its main goal that was formulated at the time of its establishment. However, CDE can also carry out other activities and initiatives that are not directly related to the main goal but still contribute to the realization of its vision.



At CDE, the main goal is related to the provision of humanitarian aid in the event of natural and other disasters. However, it also carries out other activities, such as collecting funds for humanitarian purposes, raising public awareness of the problems faced by people in different parts of the world, cooperation with other organizations and governments to improve the living situation and other activities that contribute to the realization of the vision of CDE.

In addition, CDE also carries out activities at the local level including aiding local communities facing various challenges and problems, such as poverty, educational needs, health needs, and more. CDE also runs various campaigns to raise awareness of local issues and mobilize local communities to take action.

The parallel activities carried out by CDE are important because they can contribute to the realization of the vision and goals of the organization in the long term. These activities include providing education and training for people working in CDE improving technological infrastructure, developing new projects and initiatives, and strengthening partnerships with other organizations and governments.

Cooperation in various humanitarian projects is extremely important for CDE because it contributes to the improvement of humanitarian conditions in countries that have faced natural disasters. A forum created by CDE for meetings with representatives of the government and other state institutions in a given country can serve as a platform for information exchange and coordination of humanitarian efforts on the ground.



Cooperation with state governments and their representatives

Cooperation with representatives of the government and other state institutions is important, as these institutions usually have access to important information and resources that can be used to effectively implement humanitarian efforts. Joint work can contribute to a better organization of humanitarian efforts, a faster response to people's needs after natural disasters, and a more efficient and targeted use of funds.

Active role of CDE Members

The active role of CDE Members is key to the effective implementation of humanitarian efforts after natural disasters. Members of the CDE can be experienced professionals who have the knowledge and skills to implement humanitarian projects on the ground. The active participation of the members of the CDE is the key to the effective implementation of humanitarian efforts after natural disasters, as they have a lot of experience and knowledge that they can use in the implementation of humanitarian projects in the field. disasters. This may include training local residents in first aid, building shelters, providing clean drinking water, improving sanitation and other infrastructure projects that contribute to improving the living conditions of local communities. The cooperation of the members of the CDE with local authorities and organizations can also contribute to the long-term sustainability and effectiveness of projects for reconstruction and relief after natural disasters.

The active role of CDE members can also increase public awareness of the importance of humanitarian efforts after natural disasters and encourage wider support for these efforts. The cooperation of the Organization's members can serve as an example to other individuals and organizations who want to join in efforts to improve the humanitarian situation in countries that have faced natural disasters. Members of the CDE can become ambassadors of humanitarian work and encourage others to contribute to improving the humanitarian situation after natural disasters. By their example, they can inspire individuals and organizations to get involved in humanitarian efforts and thereby help those who are most affected. Together we can achieve much more than we could do alone.

Members of the CDE play a key role in providing humanitarian aid and reconstruction after natural disasters, as they are actively involved in the process at all levels, from the preparation of plans and strategies to the organization of logistics, transportation of goods and supply of the population. Their efforts are key to providing quick, effective and adequate aid in the event of natural disasters and to improving the humanitarian situation in the affected countries.



Operation and activities of the CDE at the local level

The operation of the CDE at the local level includes many activities aimed at providing humanitarian aid and reconstruction after natural disasters and to improve the humanitarian situation in individual countries. These activities include the organization and logistics of:

- **natural disasters and disasters:** The CDE provides assistance in the event of natural disasters and disasters, including the organization and coordination of humanitarian aid such as food, medicine, clothing and shelter. The CDE is a specialized organization for providing assistance in the event of natural disasters and catastrophes. Its activities focus on providing humanitarian aid, reconstruction and logistics assistance, and organizing preparations for possible future disasters. The CDE also cooperates with the competent authorities in the countries in order to ensure the most effective and coordinated action in the event of natural disasters and catastrophes;
- **preparation of logistics for the transport of goods:** The CDE helps in the organization and preparation of logistics for the transport of goods that are necessary for the provision of humanitarian aid and reconstruction after natural disasters. This includes preparation of transport plans, inventory and storage management, transport organization and monitoring, and provision of relevant documents for import and export. The CDE works with various carriers and logistics companies to ensure efficient and safe transportation of goods to their destinations. It also coordinates with the competent authorities in the countries to



ensure the smooth passage of goods across borders and other administrative barriers;

- **preparation of goods in case of natural disasters:** this is the operation of the CDE, which focuses on the preparation of the necessary humanitarian aid in the event of natural disasters. The CDE prepares appropriate goods and ensures the supply of medicine, food, water, clothing, accommodation and other necessities to the affected population. The aim is to provide emergency assistance in the first days after the disaster, when the needs are greatest. In doing so, the CDE works closely with local authorities, non-governmental organizations and other humanitarian agencies to ensure efficient and coordinated action;
- **preparation for reconstruction in the event of natural disasters:** The CDE helps in the preparation of plans and strategies for reconstruction after natural disasters, including organization and coordination with the competent authorities in the countries. CDE strives to be proactive in preparing for potential natural disasters and providing adequate recovery plans and strategies. This also includes cooperation with local authorities and competent agencies for managing crisis situations and providing education and training for the prevention and management of natural disasters;
- **reconstruction after natural disasters:** The CDE helps in the reconstruction of infrastructure, houses and other facilities that were damaged or destroyed during a natural disaster. CDE is committed to disaster recovery and can help organize the funding, logistics, equipment and expertise needed for recovery projects. The goal is to restore destroyed infrastructure and help people recover as quickly as possible after a natural disaster;



- **humanitarian actions:** The CDE organizes humanitarian actions to collect funds and aid for countries affected by natural disasters. Humanitarian actions are thus a key area of activity of the CDE. The goal of humanitarian campaigns is to collect as many funds and aid as possible and direct them to the most endangered areas. The CDE cooperates with various organizations, companies and individuals who advocate for help and solidarity with those affected by natural disasters. This can improve people's quality of life and help them re-establish normal life after a natural disaster;

- **State counseling at a high level of the country:** The CDE advises countries at a high level in the provision of humanitarian aid and reconstruction after natural disasters. This is a very important area of activity of the CDE, as it advocates close cooperation with representatives of state institutions in the planning and implementation of humanitarian projects. CDE provides expertise and experience to help countries deliver effective and efficient humanitarian aid and disaster recovery. This allows us to avoid potential problems and complications and quickly and efficiently help those who are affected;

- **logistic intervention in special cases of the country's needs:** The CDE is aware that natural disasters can cause many specific needs and problems for the affected countries, which can only be solved by specialized logistics. The CDE therefore also deals with logistical mediation in special cases of the country's needs.

This includes:

- provision of emergency medical assistance and medicines in affected areas;



- provision of special equipment and machines for rescue and rehabilitation after natural disasters;
- transport and distribution of food, water and other basic necessities in affected areas;
- provision of expert yaks and other qualified persons to assist in the reconstruction and rehabilitation of affected areas;
- intervention in the provision of transport and care for vulnerable groups such as the disabled, the elderly and children.

In its work, the CDE cooperates with experts from various fields, who help in the planning and implementation of specialized logistics and ensuring the effective resolution of problems in the event of natural disasters;

- **human rights:** The CDE advocates respect for human rights in countries affected by natural disasters and other crisis situations. The organization believes that human rights are universal and indivisible and advocates for their respect throughout the world. In its work, the CDE focuses on ensuring human rights in countries and promoting the equality and dignity of all people. The CDE strives to cooperate with local organizations and authorities and to establish long-term solutions for ensuring human rights in affected countries. The organization is also committed to raising awareness and education about the importance of respecting human rights and promoting social change that will ensure a sustainable and just future for all people;
- **international consulting:** The CDE provides international consulting and assistance in the organization and implementation of humanitarian projects after natural disasters and other crisis situations. The CDE can advise on the planning



and implementation of humanitarian projects and provide expertise and support in crisis management. CDE connects with partners and experts around the world to provide best practices and expertise related to humanitarian projects. This may include training for staff in humanitarian organizations, preparing for potential crisis situations, advising on best practices in providing humanitarian aid, and sharing information on various humanitarian projects and initiatives. The CDE works to improve the effectiveness of humanitarian projects around the world and to ensure the fair and appropriate distribution of aid to those who need it most;

- **international logistics:** The CDE organizes and provides international logistics for humanitarian projects all over the world. This includes preparing and organizing the transport of goods, monitoring supplies and distributing aid according to local needs and conditions. The CDE liaises with companies, partners and other humanitarian organizations around the world to ensure that humanitarian aid is delivered to the target locations in the shortest possible time. In addition, the CDE also provides expert advice and training on logistics and crisis management to help countries and other organizations prepare for potential future disasters or crises.



Operation and activities of CDE at the international level

CDE works at the international level and provides humanitarian aid in various areas around the world. Its logistics are adapted to the specific needs and circumstances of each area.

- In the EU area, CDE can cooperate with local agencies and organizations that provide humanitarian aid. Through joint efforts in the EU area, CDE can focus on providing logistical support and coordination of humanitarian efforts in cooperation with local agencies and organizations. This may include the transport and distribution of food, medicines, necessities, and other goods, as well as the provision of shelter and assistance in rebuilding infrastructure after natural disasters or other crises.
- In the area of the Balkans, CDE cooperates with several agencies and organizations that provide humanitarian aid. CDE can play an important role in providing humanitarian aid in the Balkans where in the past, they have faced various humanitarian challenges, such as war conflicts, natural disasters, and refugee crises. CDE may work with other organizations and agencies to provide necessary humanitarian aid and supply food, water, medicine, clothing, and shelter.
- In Africa, CDE helps solve humanitarian challenges, such as natural disasters, famine, diseases, refugee flows, and conflicts. Logistics can include the transportation of food, medicine, water, and other goods that are necessary for the survival and supply of the population. In Africa, CDE plays an important role in



implementing humanitarian efforts and solving various challenges. Natural disasters, such as floods, droughts, and heat waves are common in the region, often causing hunger and a lack of basic goods. In addition, various conflicts are also present in Africa that cause refugee flows and worsen the humanitarian situation. CDE focuses on providing emergency humanitarian assistance, including medicine, food, water, shelter, and other goods, and supporting long-term community development and recovery.

- In Asia, CDE works to address a wide range of humanitarian challenges, including natural disasters, famine, disease, refugee flows, and conflict. Logistics can focus on transporting medicine, food, clothing, and shelter. Asia often deals with natural disasters, such as earthquakes, tsunamis, floods, and hurricanes, which can cause many humanitarian challenges. In addition, CDE focuses on supporting local communities by providing access to healthcare, education, and other basic needs. CDE also has a reconstruction assistance program that helps rebuild infrastructure and other facilities after natural disasters and other conflicts.

- In the area of the Middle East, CDE participates in solving many humanitarian challenges, including refugee flows, conflicts, and natural disasters. Logistics can focus on transporting medicine, food, clothing, and shelter. Our experts have already participated in solving the listed challenges in the past. Their logistics focus on the transportation of medicine, food, clothing, and shelter which are necessary for the survival and supply of the population. CDE also works with local organizations and the government to improve the humanitarian situation and provide better assistance to people in need.



- In the area of Central America, CDE helps to solve humanitarian challenges, such as natural disasters, refugee flows, conflicts, and poverty. Logistics can include the transportation of food, medicine, clothing, and other goods that are necessary for the survival and supply of the population. In addition to the supply of goods, CDE in Central America can also provide professional assistance in the reconstruction of infrastructure and other important facilities that have been damaged or destroyed in natural disasters. - In South America, CDE participates in solving many humanitarian challenges, such as natural disasters, refugee flows, conflicts, and poverty. Logistics can focus on transporting food, medicine, clothing, and other necessities for residents affected by natural disasters, such as floods, landslides, droughts, and forest fires. In addition, CDE participates in the construction and rehabilitation of infrastructure, such as roads, bridges, schools, and hospitals, thereby contributing to the sustainable reconstruction of communities. In the area of South America, CDE also focuses on improving the sustainable use of natural resources, which includes projects to improve agricultural practices, promote renewable energy sources, and protect the environment.



Areas of activity of CDE

CDE operates in many areas:

- **economics:** help in developing the economy, creating jobs, improving infrastructure, and promoting trade;
- **humanitarian and healthcare:** The organization focuses on providing humanitarian aid in the event of natural disasters, war conflicts, and other crises. In addition, CDE may participate in the provision of healthcare and education on health topics;
- **agriculture:** The organization can help in the development of agriculture and the improvement of agricultural production in different regions of the world;
- **education:** CDE can participate in the development of education and ensure access to education for children and young people in different countries;
- **science and research:** The organization can focus on promoting science, research, and innovation and providing research support in various fields;
- **information:** The organization can participate in promoting media freedom and providing access to quality information for people around the world;
- **defense and protection:** CDE can focus on providing support in defense and security and in improving protection systems against natural disasters and other hazards;



- **industry:** The organization can participate in promoting sustainable production and improving production processes in various sectors;
- **environment:** CDE can help preserve the environment, promote sustainable development, and support projects to reduce the carbon footprint;
- **transport:** The organization can participate in the development of transport infrastructure and the improvement of transport in different regions;
- **law and legal:** CDE can participate in promoting law and ensuring access to justice and improving the legal system in different countries;
- **security:** CDE can focus on ensuring security and stability in regions facing conflicts and other security challenges;
- **human rights:** CDE can help promote and protect human rights at various levels including defending the rights of women, children, minorities, refugees, and other vulnerable groups. The organization can work with civil society, government agencies, and international organizations to ensure the protection of human rights and to monitor and report on potential violations. CDE can also help educate people about human rights and promote their respect and develop effective mechanisms to address human rights violations.

The areas of operation of CDE are divided according to the members and departments of each member and are internationally oriented and not limited to a single country. This makes it possible to combine departments for certain operational purposes, which enables the organization to solve challenges in individual areas more efficiently and comprehensively.



Cooperation with other organizations around the world

CDE is also prepared to cooperate with other, similar organizations from the EU, and other world organizations in terms of cooperation at a high diplomatic level, which is extremely important for the effective implementation of the organization's humanitarian and other projects because cooperation with other organizations can bring greater support, financial resources, and different types of expertise. Joint efforts at the diplomatic level can also contribute to achieving a better understanding between countries and solving international conflicts.

Talks with the EU Commission, NATO, WHO, and other organizations could bring important synergies and connections that would enable CDE to operate more efficiently and coordinate humanitarian aid at the international level. Cooperation with local organizations and societies in countries would also ensure a better connection with the communities and culture they want to support, which is crucial in providing effective and relevant assistance.

Cooperation with the European Commission would be useful for CDE in obtaining financial resources and exchanging information about the policies and strategies of the European Union in various areas that are important for CDE, such as humanitarian aid, healthcare, agriculture, the environment, and others. In addition, cooperation with the European Commission would help ensure compliance with European standards and rules. CDE could also participate in the implementation of EU-funded projects or the preparation of funding proposals.



CDE can cooperate with NATO in the field of defense and security logistics and the training of members of the army and other security forces. CDE could provide logistical support in the event of crises and natural disasters and participate in the implementation of humanitarian aid under NATO objectives.

The UNHRC is the United Nations body that deals with human rights. CDE can work with the UNHRC to aid and support the protection of human rights in countries where it is needed. Discussions on cooperation with the UNHRC would thus include the exchange of information and experience, coordination of activities, and support for projects that contribute to the realization of the goals of both organizations in the field of human rights.

CDE also wants to work with UNHCR, the Office of the United Nations High Commissioner for Refugees, which provides protection and assistance to refugees and asylum seekers. Cooperation with UNHCR could enable CDE to help refugees and asylum seekers in a more efficient and coordinated manner, especially in the areas of care, nutrition, and medical care. With its logistical support and expertise, CDE could also help in the implementation of programs to permanently solve the refugee problem and improve conditions in their homelands.

CDE may cooperate with the World Health Organization (WHO) in providing medical care and assistance in the event of disease outbreaks or other health emergencies. This could include logistical support for the transport of medical supplies and medicines, professional assistance in the delivery of health services, and coordination with other humanitarian agencies and local authorities.
